### Community Care Program

### "...helping older people live independently"

Established in 1979 by Public Act 81-202, the Illinois Department on Aging Community Care Program helps senior citizens, who might otherwise need nursing home care, to remain in their own homes by providing in-home and community-based services.

This program is aimed at helping seniors maintain their independence and providing cost effective alternatives to nursing home placement. The Community Care Program provides services to any person who applies for the program and meets all current eligibility requirements.

#### Who is eligible?

People who ...

- ·Are 60 years old or older
- ·Are U.S. citizens or legal aliens
- Are residents of Illinois
- •Have non-exempt assets of \$17,500 or less (Non-exempt assets do not include home, car, or personal furnishings.)
- •Have an assessed need for long term care (scoring 29 points or higher on the "Determination Of Need" form).

NOTE: Although the level of income does not affect eligibility for the program, an income is established for each client to determine the client's ability to contribute to the cost of care.

### **Emergency Home Response Service: (EHRS)**

EHRS is a Community Care Program core service provided to improve the independence and safety of clients in their own homes and help reduce the need for nursing home care.



Emergency Home Response Service (EHRS) is a 24-hour emergency communication link to assistance outside the home for older adults with documented health and safety needs and mobility limitations. This service is provided by a two-way voice communication system consisting of a base unit and an activation device worn by the participant that will automatically link the older adult to a professionally trained staffed support center. For more information on Emergency Home Response Services in your community, contact Senior Services at 217-347-5569.

EHRS offers 24-hours-a-day help at the touch of a button, installation at no cost to the client, free adaptive activation devices, and a list of first responders chosen by the client. To receive this service, an older adult must qualify for the Community Care Program.



# Protect yourself and your Social Security Information!

Social Security numbers are the skeleton key to identity theft. And what better way to get someone's Social Security number than by pretending to be from Social Security? The Social Security Administration (SSA) estimates that scammers call thousands of Americans every day, looking to gather personal information, steal benefits or both.

The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) reported a surge in late 2018 in scams involving fake SSA employees calling people with warnings that their Social Security numbers had been linked to criminal activity and suspended. The caller asks you to confirm your number so he or she can reactivate it or issue you a new one, for a fee. This is no emergency but a ploy to get money and personal data: Social Security does not block or suspend numbers, ever. This con is sometimes executed by robocall – the recording provides a number for you to call to remedy the problem. In another version, the caller says your bank account is at risk due to the illicit activity and offers to help you keep it safe.

On the other hand, you might get a call from a supposed SSA representative bearing good news – say, a cost-of-living increase in your benefits. To get the extra money, you have to verify your name, date of birth and Social Security number. Armed with those identifiers, scammers can effectively hijack your account, asking SSA to change the address, phone number and direct deposit information on your record and thus diverting your benefits.

#### **Warning Signs:**

- You get an unsolicited call from someone claiming to work for SSA. Except in rare circumstances, you will not get a call from Social Security unless you have already been in contact with the agency.
- > The caller asks for your Social Security number-again, something an actual SSA employee wouldn't do.
- A call or email threatens consequences, such as arrest, loss of benefits or suspension of your Social Security number, if you do not provide a payment or personal information.

#### What YOU Should Do:

- Do hang up if someone calls you out of the blue and claims to be from SSA, DON'T interact and DON'T engage, simply hang up and contact your local police department.
- ➤ Do be skeptical if a caller claims to be an "Officer with the Inspector General of Social Security." Scammers work hard at sounding official—and often will use actual government titles to make themselves seem authentic and important.
- > Do install a robocall-blocking app on your smartphone, or sign up for a robocall-blocking service from your mobile network provider.


