

Emergency Home Response Service: (EHRS)
EHRS is a Community Care Program core service provided to improve the independence and safety of clients in their own homes and help reduce the need for nursing home care.



Emergency Home Response Service (EHRS) is a 24-hour emergency communication link to assistance outside the home for older adults with documented health and safety needs and mobility limitations. This service is provided by a two-way voice communication system consisting of a base unit and an activation device worn by the participant that will automatically link the older adult to a professionally trained staffed support center. For more information on Emergency Home Response Services in your community, contact Senior Services at 217-347-5569.

EHRS offers 24-hours-a-day help at the touch of a button, installation at no cost to the client, free adaptive activation devices, and a list of first responders chosen by the client. To receive this service, an older adult must qualify for the Community Care Program or you can have the device installed and pay for the services independently.

Did you know...

Every four years the world allows time to catch up and this year it is called leap year 2016.

Have you ever wondered why the earth needs an extra day every fourth year?

What exactly is a leap day? The world is a mysterious place until someone explains the simple phenomena experienced. Learn a few obscure facts about leap day and then head into leap year 2016 armed with knowledge.

What Is Leap Year?

The definition of leap year according to the *Merriam-Webster Dictionary* is "a year in the Gregorian calendar containing 366 days with February 29th as the extra day." That makes perfect sense, but why does the earth need an extra day? The years that are not leap years are called common years. In common years, the calendar has 365 days. Leap day occurs to synchronize the solar year with the calendar year.

Keeping time aligned with the sun's rotation means that when its spring the sun is warming up the earth and planting can begin in temperate zones. Using a 365-day calendar creates an error of about .2422 days or approximately six hours. In 100 years, the earth would be 24 days ahead of the seasons. The earth has used the Gregorian calendar since 1582 with an error of 27 seconds that adds up to one day every 3,236 years. Leap year rectifies this error keeping the time of year and the path of the sun synchronized.

Julius Caesar invented leap year in 45 BCE, or rather, Sosigenes his astronomer did. The Roman calendar had 355 days. In order to keep seasons and festivals even with the calendar a 22nd or 23rd day was added every second year. Eventually days were added to different months resulting in 365-day calendar. By: Forbes

If you qualify for services, the staff member will work with you to determine your needs and goals, and assist you in setting up services that are appropriate for you and keep in touch with you to make sure the services continue to meet your needs.


Monthly Potluck - February 4th at 11:30 am


February 20th- Resale shopping and lunch in Charleston and Mattoon area
