Effingham Farmers Market



Emergency Home Response Service: (EHRS)

EHRS is a Community Care Program core service provided to improve the independence and safety of clients in their own homes and help reduce the need for nursing home care.



Emergency Home Response Service (EHRS) is a 24-hour emergency communication link to assistance outside the home for older adults with documented health and safety needs and mobility limitations. This service is provided by a two-way voice communication system consisting of a base unit and an activation device worn by the participant that will automatically link the older adult to a professionally trained staffed support center. For more information on Emergency Home Response Services in your community, contact Senior Services at 217-347-5569.

EHRS offers 24-hours-a-day help at the touch of a button, installation at no cost to the client, free adaptive activation devices, and a list of first responders chosen by the client. To receive this service, an older adult must qualify for the Community Care Program. This service is now available for cell phones too.

"The Grandparent Scam"

Beware if you receive an urgent phone call from someone claiming to be a family member!

This is how the grandparent scam typically plays out: You get a call from someone pretending to be your grandchild. The person explains that she/he is in trouble, with a story that goes something like this:

"There's been an accident and I'm (in jail, in the hospital, stuck in a foreign country), and I need your help." The caller adds enough details about how, what or where the emergency happened to make the story seem plausible. And the distraught caller, you think to yourself, does sort of sound like your grandson or granddaughter.

Often the caller tells you that a third person, such as a lawyer, doctor or police officer, will "explain everything to you" if you call him or her. "This makes it seem more real when you call and talk to the *authority,*" says attorney Kati Daffan, assistant director of the division of marketing practices at the Federal Trade Commission (FTC). Then the caller asks you to send or wire money immediately, with the kicker, "Please, don't tell Mom and Dad!"

In 2017 nearly one in five people reported losing money in an impostor scheme like the grandparent scam, amounting to a loss of \$328 million, according to the FTC. And those ages 70 and older have suffered the highest average losses. "The <u>scammers</u> are very good at what they do — they make the story very convincing and urgent so that you wouldn't want to make a mistake," Daffan says. "The stakes are incredibly high, and they're good at pulling at your emotions. They know how to get your fight-or-flight response activated so that your critical thinking faculties are just not the way they are normally."

Here's what you need to know about this scam:

- Verify the person's identity by asking questions someone else couldn't possibly answer.
- Ask for a callback number and then get off the phone and check with a family member or the person who supposedly called you.
- Contact your local law enforcement and have them assist you in finding out the truth.
- A dead giveaway that you're trying to be scammed is how they want you to get the money to them. (Typically, it's through a wire transfer service (such as Western Union or MoneyGram), an overnight delivery service or courier (with a check or cash), or a prepaid card or gift card, in which case the scammer will ask you to read the numbers on the back of the card over the phone. <u>Don't do it!</u>
- Remember, a hospital or court of law doesn't accept gift cards as payment.

Illinois Department on Aging Community Care Program

Established in 1979 by Public Act 81-202, the Illinois Department on Aging's Community Care Program helps senior citizens, who might otherwise need nursing home care, to remain in their own homes by providing in-home and community-based services.

...aimed at assisting seniors to maintain their independence and providing cost effective alternatives to nursing home placement.

The Community Care Program provides services to any person who applies for the program and meets all current eligibility requirements.

Who is eligible?

People who...

Are 60 years old or older;

Are U.S. citizens or legal aliens;

Are residents of Illinois;



Have non-exempt assets of \$17,500 or less (Non-exempt assets do not include home, car, or personal furnishings.); and

Have an assessed need for long term care (scoring 29 points or higher on the "Determination of Need" form).

NOTE: Although the level of income does not affect eligibility for the program, an income level is established for each client to determine the client's ability to contribute to the cost of care. **Call Senior Services Today for an assessment, now serving 9 counties 217-347-5569!**


