Be a **Savvy** Senior

Senior Services have been made aware of many more attempts at scamming Seniors, therefore we are introducing this new segment in the Sunset Times Newsletter entitled "Be a Savvy Senior". Our goal is that our efforts will help to educate, inform, and assist seniors and their friends and family on how to be protected from those wolves in our world who are dressed in sheep's clothing. We hope this new addition will empower and educate you on this ever-changing world we all live in.

"The Sweetheart Scam" is one of the most widely utilized scams of preying upon a victim for financial gain. It's a scheme that can be perpetrated online or in person. The scammer convinces their victim that they are in love and uses these emotions to take money from the unsuspecting person—often times a lonely senior. Although almost any age group can be lured into this game of deceit, Seniors—especially widows, widowers and recent divorcees—are particularly vulnerable to this manipulation of the heart; it is not gender specific either; both men and women are equally victimized.

10 Tips for Spotting and Avoiding Scams:

- 1. **Be on your guard.** Whether you are interacting with people online or in person at a restaurant, grocery store or the post office, make a point of keeping your wits about you. Unfortunately, deception comes in all shapes and sizes and takes place in a variety of settings.
- 2. **Be honest with yourself.** Look in the mirror and ask yourself the million-dollar question: "Why would a much younger individual want anything to do with me?" What are they getting out of a relationship with you? If you discover anything pertaining to money is your answer, you are headed for trouble.
- 3. **Never transfer or wire money to anyone.** This is especially important if you're communicating with a stranger living overseas whom you've never met in person. Remember: Once you send your money, it is FOREVER GONE!
- 4. **Keep in touch with family.** Share your new social interests and friendships with them. Your loved ones usually have your best interest in mind and can be trusted to provide honest advice and guidance.
- 5. **Consult a professional if an online relationship seems fishy.** Law enforcement agents are experienced with sweetheart scams, especially since the increase usage of social media, such as Facebook, LinkedIn and Twitter. If you have a feeling that something isn't quite right contact local law enforcement.
- 6. **Do your homework.** Use Google to search for additional information on new individuals you meet and cross check the information they've told you about themselves. Even if things appear to match up, don't assume they're telling you the truth. Scammers often go to great lengths to pose as another person.
- 7. Limit your use of social media. Scammers steal personal information online and utilize people's social media profiles to learn more about them. They then use this information to tailor their manipulative approach to appeal to a person's specific interests and weaknesses. Some scammers even monitor potential victims' news feeds for information on friends and relatives they can pose as.
- 8. Pursue relationships face-to-face. Avoid online dating if at all possible.
- 9. **Don't feel ashamed.** Although getting defrauded is embarrassing, understand that scammers have learned how to be very convincing and they have mastered the art of deceiving people.
- 10. **Use common sense.** This goes for any interactions with strangers, both online and in person. If something seems too good to be true, it usually is.

Care Program for 9 counties within the State of Illinois? The counties we serve are: Effingham, Clay, Fayette, Jefferson, Marion, Jasper, Crawford, Richland, and Lawrence. All of our offices are your direct linkage to all the information you need regarding community based services that can give you many added benefits that enhance your quality of life. As you prepare to retire or if you become disabled, the staff members in our offices will assist you with the services that will allow you to remain in your own home, and keep you out of a nursing home, as long as nursing home placement is not necessary for you. We will send out staff to your home at no cost to discuss your needs and goals, and to help you choose what services might be right for you. Services include In-Home Service, Adult Day Services, Emergency Home Response Service, Home Delivered Meals, Respite Care for the Caregiver, and in some areas of the state, Senior Companion. If you qualify for services, the staff member will work with you to determine your needs, set up services that are appropriate for you and keep in touch with you to make sure the services continue to meet your needs. Emergency Home Response Service: (EHRS)

EHRS is a Community Care Program core service provided to improve the independence and safety of clients in their own homes and help reduce the need for nursing home care.



Emergency Home Response Service (EHRS) is a 24-hour emergency communication link to assistance outside the home for older adults with documented health and safety needs and mobility limitations. This service is provided by a two-way voice communication system consisting of a base unit and an activation device worn by the participant that will automatically link the older adult to a professionally trained staffed support center. For more information on Emergency Home Response Services in your community, contact Senior Services at 217-347-5569

EHRS offers 24-hours-a-day help at the touch of a button, installation at no cost to the client, free adaptive activation devices, and a list of first responders chosen by the client. To receive this service, an older adult must qualify for the Community Care Program. This service is now available for cell phones too.
