# Long Term Care Ombudsman, Resident.... Advocate!



As an individual living in a long-term care facility, you retain the same rights as every citizen of Illinois and of the United States. The Illinois Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program strives to protect and promote the rights and quality of life for those who reside in long-term care facilities. This month, in part 4 of our Ombudsman spotlight, we are highlighting more regulations and providing more clarity on specific rights granted to residents living in long-term care facilities.

#### Your rights in paying for your care and getting Medicare and Medicaid

- If you are paying for some or all of your care at your facility, you must be given a contract that states what services are provided by the facility and how much they cost. The contract must say what expenses are not part of the regular rate.
- Your facility must not require anyone else to sign an agreement saying that they will pay your bill if you cannot pay it yourself. The only one who can be required to pay your bill for you is a court appointed guardian or someone else who is handling your money for you.
- Your facility must give you information about how to apply for Medicaid and Medicare and rules
  about "prevention of spousal impoverishment." Prevention of spousal impoverishment rules allow you
  to give money and property to your spouse and still be eligible for Medicaid.
- You have a right to apply for Medicaid or Medicare to help pay for your care.
- If you get Medicaid, the facility may not make you pay for anything that Medicaid pays for. The facility must give you a written list of what items and services Medicaid pays for, and for items and services for which you could be charged.

#### Your rights to stay in your facility

- You have the right to keep living in your facility.
- You must be given written notice if your facility wants you to move from the facility. The reasons for asking you to leave must only be for the following reasons:
  - a) you are a danger to yourself or others;
  - b) your needs cannot be med by the facility;
  - c) your health has improved and you no longer need the services of a long-term care facility;
  - d) you have not paid your bill after reasonable notice;
  - e) your facility closes.

#### The notice must:

- o tell you why your facility wants you to move;
- o tell you how to appeal the decision to the Illinois Department of Public Health;
- o provide a stamped and addressed envelope for you to mail your appeal in; and
- be received 30 days prior to the day they want you to move from a Medicare or Medicaid certified facility
- o be received 21 days prior to the day they want you to move from a State licensed facility.

#### **Community Care Program**

#### ".... Helping older people live independently"

The State of Illinois created the Illinois Community Care Program (CCP) for seniors who are at risk of being prematurely placed in a Medicaid-funded nursing home. This program seeks to support the elderly in remaining at home or in the home of caregivers. Thereby they can avoid costly state-funded nursing home care. CCP achieves this goal by paying for a variety of services, supports, and technologies that enable independent living or ease the workload on family caregivers. For example, adult day care and personal care in-home are covered. This allows family members who care for an elderly loved one at home to work during normal business hours.

CCP allows both Medicaid eligible and non-Medicaid eligible persons to receive the services they need to remain living in the community. On average, slightly more than 50% of program participants are enrolled via Medicaid.

ECCOA Senior Services is contracted with the Illinois Department on Aging to provide the Community Care Program for 9 counties within the State of Illinois. The counties we serve are: Effingham, Clay, Fayette, Jefferson, Marion, Jasper, Crawford, Richland, and Lawrence. All of our offices are your direct linkage to all the information you need regarding community based services that can give you many added benefits that enhance your quality of life. As you prepare to retire or if you become disabled, the staff members in our offices will assist you with the services that will allow you to remain in your own home, and keep you out of a nursing home, as long as nursing home placement is not necessary for you. We will send staff to your home at no cost to discuss your needs and goals, and to help you choose what services might be right for you. If you qualify for services, the staff member will work with you to determine your needs, set up services that are appropriate for you and keep in touch with you to make sure the services continue to meet your needs.









# Do you know an older adult who is alone for significant parts of the day or night with no regular caregiver?



#### What is Emergency Home Response Service?

Emergency Home Response Service (EHRS) is a 24-hour emergency communication link to assistance outside the home for older adults with documented health and safety needs and mobility limitations. This service is provided by a two-way voice communication system consisting of a base unit and an activation device worn by the participant that will automatically link the older adult to a professionally staffed support center.

#### Who needs this service?

Older adults who could benefit from this service might experience some of the following:

- unsteadiness, dizziness, weakness and history of falling,
- · limited mobility (i.e., a cane, walker or wheelchair),
- history of cardiac or respiratory crises at home,
- illnesses that typically result in sudden changes in health status (i.e., diabetes, seizures, hypoglycemia)
- · large number of medications and side effects that produce indicators on this list, or
- · circulatory or other problems that may result in falls.

#### This is a Community Care Program (CCP) service.

The purpose of providing EHRS is to improve the independence and safety of participants in their own homes and help reduce the need for nursing home care.

#### What are the benefits of the EHRS?

- Worry-free 24-hours-a-day help at the touch of a button
- Installation at no cost to the participant
- Free adaptive activation devices
- A list of first responders chosen by the participant
- Free to eligible older adults

#### Who is eligible for the CCP Program?

An older adult must qualify for the CCP program to receive EHRS. You are eligible for CCP service if you:

- are sixty (60) years of age or older,
- are an Illinois Resident.
- are a U.S. citizen or legal alien.
- are determined to be physically in need of service (meaning at least moderately impaired),
- meet the financial asset requirements (explained by a care coordinator during an in-home visit,
- obtain a signed Physician's Statement agreeing that CCP services are necessary and appropriate, and
- are willing to cooperate with a care coordinator.

#### Why should I take a Rules of the Road Class?

The Rules of the Road Review Course is designed to give drivers – especially senior citizens – the knowledge and confidence needed to renew or obtain a driver's license. The Review Course combines an explanation of the driving exam with a practice written exam. The questions and information in the Rules of the Road Review Course are provided only to help you measure your knowledge of driving skills and Illinois traffic laws. Participants will not be graded on their answers on the practice exam.
